*A View Most Glorious* is the third book in Scott's series, *American Wonders Collection*. The books in this series are all based in a beautiful natural setting (often a National Park), in a historically significant time.

Cora Baxter lives in Tacoma, Washington in 1893. She lives a privileged life, in spite of the turmoil and financial distress much of the country is experiencing. Her ideas however don't coincide with much of the Tacoma Society, in fact, she enjoys her job at her stepfather's bank, and her role as a suffragette. Cora's mother just sees Cora's future quite differently and has plans for Cora to settle well and start a family. Cora's plans are to climb Mt Rainier, hoping the publicity will also bring attention to her desire to promote voting rights for women. But first, she must find a guide that will agree to take her up Mt. Rainier.

Scott's descriptions of the beautiful scenery, and her understanding of the restrictions on women in the late 1800s brings this easy reading story to life. Eureka Public Library carries all three books in the *American Wonders Collection*.
