Alerts: this story is part eerie historical mystery, part disaster, part emotional loss & trauma, and more. Because of the nature of this tale, I will not write any spoilers here. However, that means a short book review, which also means that you, reader, will just have to check this one out for yourself!

Also: some reviewers have pegged this as a story for 8-12 year olds; while others have proposed it is excellent for early teens. Up to you and/or your family, depending on the amount of creepiness, chills and mystery you are prepared to absorb!

This story has been described as "haunting, engrossing, and thoughtful." I would definitely give it that description, and so much more. This richly interwoven tale, Ansari skillfully weaves together a story of loss, grief, aloneness, and the mystery involving a weird neighbor girl; and throws in some historical disasters to boot. The combination of story elements just flows.

Twelve-year-old Cooper is feeling overwhelmed, angry & alone ever since his dad left their family to begin a new one. Added to this, he's annoyed by his little sister, Jess, and frustrated at his newly added duty of helping to care for Jess & her diabetes. Added to this is the "creepy" new neighbor girl, who seems to never speak but just keeps watching Cooper – adding further to his annoyance.

When his sister Jess discovers a strange story of a 100-year-old train crash tragedy, Cooper reluctantly agrees to take a look, welcoming the "distraction." This tragic mystery, they discover, is related to one of the dead bodies, a boy, who was never identified. As Cooper & Jess uncover more information, they discover an unbelievable connection to their strange neighbor, as reader, we find ourselves more deeply engulfed in their mystery!
