

*Elizabeth and Margaret: The Intimate World of the Windsor Sisters*, Andrew Morton

Andrew Morton has written several books about England's royal family, and is probably best known for his books on Diana. In this biography, he examines the close relationship between the queen and her younger sister, Margaret.

The early part of the book is devoted to their youth, including information concerning changes in their family and their sibling relationship as Elizabeth was trained to take on the role of queen.
