Rosalie Wright grew up at Lime Farm, the younger sister of Will and Leslie. When a flying circus comes to town, ten-year old Rosalie begs for the opportunity to go up. The experience is beyond her wildest dreams, creating a love that finds her saving money to pay for her own flying lessons. While her mother has nothing good to say about Rosalie's dreams and desires to fly, her father encourages her, allowing the love to build as Rosalie grows up.

Rosalie's father passes away suddenly when Rosalie is about to turn 18. The work of the farm becomes the responsibility of her brothers. Due to the farm, both brothers are exempt from fighting in WWII. When Rosalie hears of the Women's Air Transport Auxiliary, she sees her way out of farm life, and into a new life that will allow her to follow her dreams. Helping ferry the planes around England and Scotland's RAF bases becomes Rosalie's daily jobs, and her new group of friends are the women pilots making these daily deliveries. As the war efforts begin to tax everyone's reserves, Rosalie finds herself in new and challenging situations both on the ground and in the air. *Glamour Girls* is historical fiction, based on the *Attagirls*, and in specific, two groups of all-women plane ferry pools in Britain during WWII.
