No Reading Allowed: The WORST Read-Aloud Book Ever by Raj Haldar & Chris Carpenter, illustrated by Bryce Gladfelter

From the creative team that brought you *P* is for Pterodactyl: The WORST Alphabet Book Ever comes another hilariously weird picture book, this time with sound-alike sentences and homophones. Each pair of sentences has detailed illustrations, with bright and colorful art, showing that while the sentences sound the same, they have *very* different meanings. In the back is a helpful glossary of each of the terms introduced. They authors also note at the end of the glossary that they used some words in "unusual ways for the sake of humor." Honestly, parents will probably appreciate this book more than kids will, but it can definitely spark conversations about homophones and that the way we use words can evolve over time. As someone who absolutely loved their previous book, I also very much enjoyed this one.
