A story that reminded me of the Mary Higgins Clark lovable character Alvirah, who always solved the mystery and saved the day. *The Maid* follows that same kind of storyline. In this heartwarming book, Molly Gray is a top-notch, eccentric, possibly autistic, perfectionist maid at the Grand Regency Hotel. She excels at her job and she loves returning rooms back into "states of perfection". She lives with her Gran who is the only family she has and they live a quiet life together. Gran has taught Molly many simple rules to live by. Molly uses them quite often, telling herself "when all else fails, tidy up" and "if you don't have anything nice to say about someone, it's best to say nothing at all".

Molly's life takes a turn for the worse when she finds the wealthy, longtime, repeat guest Mr. Black dead in his room. Molly becomes a suspect and has to figure out the case to save herself, the hotel, and her friends.

I hope you will give *The Maid* a try. This was a nice clean read that I really enjoyed and look forward to the next book in the series *The Mystery Guest* to see what happens to Molly next.
